COLLEGE: 11/1/03 vs. UCLA - Michael Craven Was Named Pac-10 Player Of Week

2001-2006 Stanford Cardinal (NCAA) - Craven played in 39 career games at Stanford, finishing with 92 tackles (including 9.5 for losses), four quarterback sacks, three forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. He also chalked up two touchdowns, returning an interception 33 yards and a fumble 54 yards for scores. Michael played Inside/Outside Linebacker & Safety & was a Special Teams standout. Craven also was an outfielder on the Cardinal baseball team as a freshman in 2002. Michael Played outside linebacker his first three years, but was moved to inside linebacker prior to the 2004 campaign. Michael came to Stanford as one of the nation's top prep players. He is very athletic. He consistently runs the 40 in the 4.45-4.55 range.

HIGH SCHOOL: Craven was a consensus first-team All-America selection while attending La Quinta (Calif.) High School. PrepStar rated him as the No. 1 linebacker in the nation and included him on its "Dream Team". Craven, who also was a Parade Magazine All-America pick, started at both linebacker and tight end. He led the Blackhawks to a 13-1 record and CIF Division 8 championship as a senior, finishing with 180 tackles, 13 sacks and four interceptions (two of which were returned for touchdowns). In addition, Craven was a member of the La Quinta baseball (earned All-Desert Valley League honors) and track & field teams (personal best of 10.98 in the 100-meters).
